“OKLAHOMA” ~ The Director’s Perspective

Not long now! The show week is going to rush up on us and there is still much to do. Rehearsals are going well and overall I am very pleased. Accents are still an issue, everyone now needs to concentrate on sounding like Americans.

In these next few weeks our job is to turn you into a well-drilled company that will be able to cope with the unexpected difficulties of staging a show at the Regent Centre. Despite all our planning there will be problems, and as long as the cast knows what they are doing, all will be fine. The problem with the Regent Centre is time. It is always a battle to complete all the tasks. We will know more when the set arrives and we start assembling it. Certainly we will have to change a few moves, but if you are all confident in your parts, then it will not be an issue.

In order to give as much time as possible to technical, we are only going to do two dress rehearsals. The Monday evening will be done to piano and the Tuesday evening will run as a performance to full orchestra.

We are working on the timing of the band call on the Sunday afternoon, but there is a big Scout parade through the town centre and we need to ensure that you can get access and park. More information later.

Now is the time to think about what you are going to look like on stage. If your character is married then wear a simple ring. If you are not married but are wearing a ring, then it will have to be covered. No wrist watches. Wear nothing that sparkles, other than Gertie’s engagement ring. Let your finger nails grow. Certainly no nail varnish.

Think about how you are going to do your hair. Men decide on your beards or moustaches or clean shaven. Make sure you and Pat Barnett have spoken about costume and also footwear. You are all country folk, simple and hardworking. You have to convince the audience you are real people.

Finally have confidence in yourselves. You are a great talented cast. We just need to see that on stage.

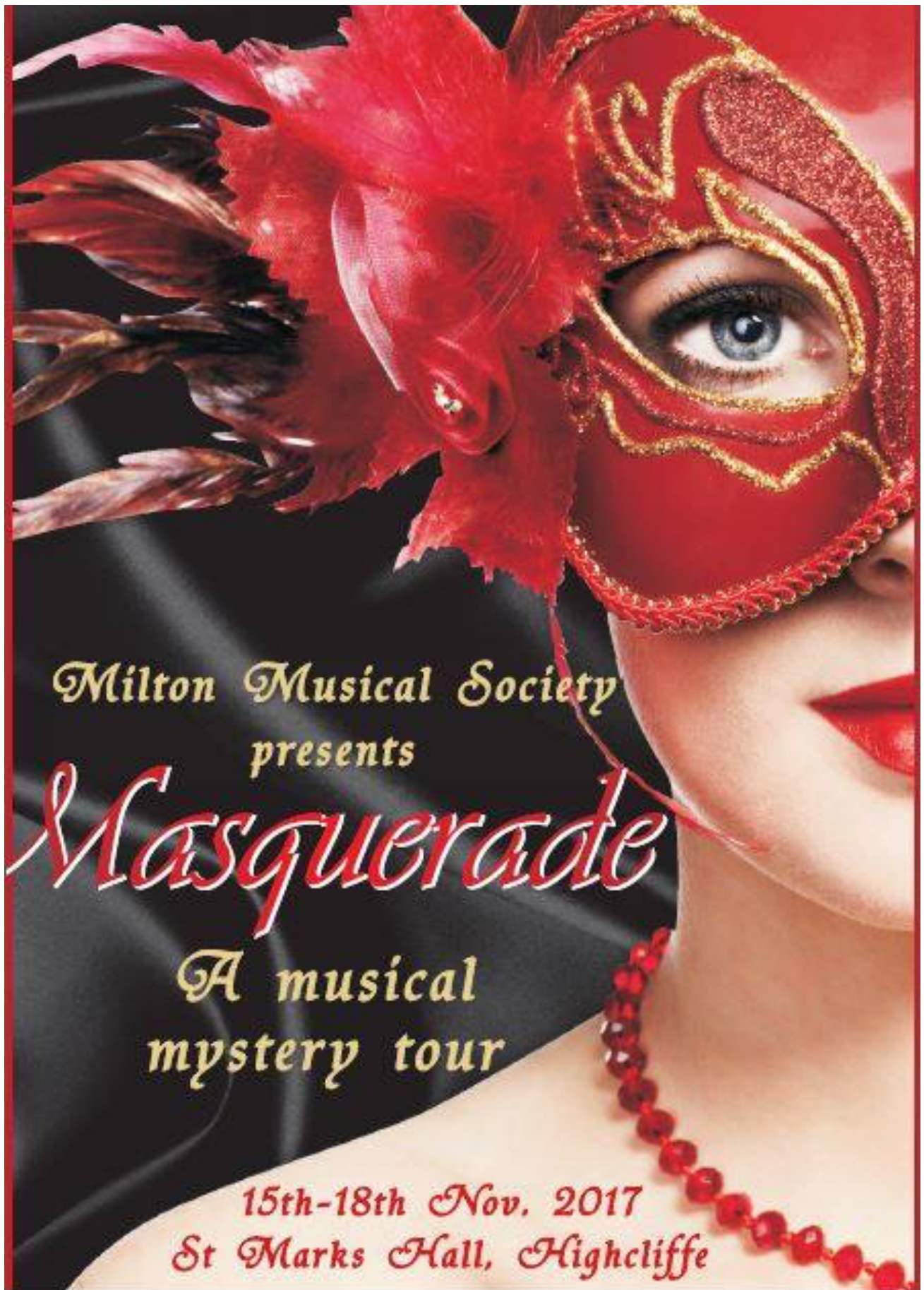
